\_\_\_\_\_ **in** and **make** a person **sick**. <sup>6</sup>To protect others from the evil spirit, people started saying  
\_\_\_\_\_ "Bless you," **which** shows that they cared about others. <sup>7</sup>Even today, many people still say
