<sup>①</sup>A halo is a circle of light that appears around the sun or moon. <sup>②</sup>It happens when ice  
particles in the air reflect light. <sup>③</sup>This ring of light affects how we see the sun or moon.

<sup>④</sup>In psychology, there's a similar idea called the halo effect. <sup>⑤</sup>It means we often judge  
people based on our first impression. <sup>⑥</sup>If someone looks nice or confident, we **might**  
**think** they are also smart, kind, or good at their job even if we don't know them well.

<sup>⑦</sup>This often happens during part-time job interviews. <sup>⑧</sup>For example, if an applicant shows  
up with a bright smile and speaks clearly, the manager **might think**, "She **must be** great  
with customers." <sup>⑨</sup>Even if she has no work experience, she **might** still **get** the job. <sup>⑩</sup>But  
the opposite can also happen. <sup>⑪</sup>This is called the horn effect (or the "devil effect"). <sup>⑫</sup>If  
someone looks nervous or has messy hair, the manager might wrongly believe, "He's not  
reliable." <sup>⑬</sup>Just one small thing can lead to a bad impression, and they might not get the  
job.
